MANAGER'S COMMENTS

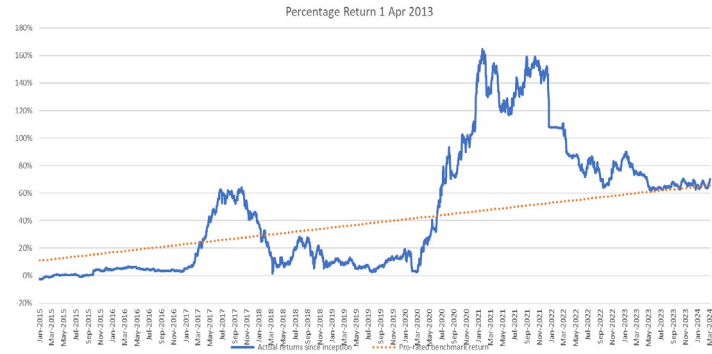
The FBMKLCI Index fell by 1% MoM to 1,536 in March 2024, after market lock in their profits after the KCI surge for 6 consecutive months. In the sectors, Property, Construction and Transport & Logistic Services were the outperformers, while the Telecommunication & Media and Consumer Products & Services were the key laggard.

Bank Negara kept interest rate unchanged at 3%. The central bank remains supportive the economy and growth prospects. On the positive side, Credit to the private non-financial sector grew by 5.1% as at end-February 2024 (January 2024: 5%), supported by higher growth in outstanding loans (5.6%; January 2024: 5.4%). Headline inflation rose higher at 1.8% in February while core inflation remained unchanged at 1.8% However, Malaysia exports fell 0.8% Y-o-Y mainly due to Lunar New Year distortions. Thematic spot line on the generative AI and data centre continue to spur interest in the lower linear.
